

Animation proposal five dialogue meetings to live the synodal process

From fall 2021 to spring 2022







PRESENTATION

The Church is summoned to a Synod by Pope Francis. This journey, under the title "For a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission", is a preparation for the celebration of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, in October 2023. Together, we will seek to cultivate, with the help from the Holy Spirit, the attitudes which favor "walking together" in order to realize and manifest what the Church truly is as a pilgrim and missionary People of God.

We propose a model of animation to live the synodal process in five meetings.

The consultation of phase 1 of the synodal process consists of 10 main questions and 3 additional questions. This facilitation tool offers two questions per meeting. If you find it difficult to take two questions during one of the meetings, then choose the one that will appeal to the participants in your group more.

The questionnaire can be found on pages 7 to 12 of the diocesan document on the synodal process. The **PDF** file of this document is available at the diocesan secretariat. The questions are also available in **WORD** file to facilitate the work of the person who will act as secretary of the meetings.

We recommend 75 to 90 minutes per meeting.

A 6th meeting may be necessary to answer the 3 additional questions, namely questions 11 to 13 which you will find on page 12 of the diocesan notebook of the synodal process.

At the end of each meeting, a person appointed as secretary will write a short summary. When your meetings are completed, a report of these summaries will be sent to Father Marc Richer (mricher@ecdl.ca). Your reports will allow us to write a diocesan summary.

Synod prayer

Dialogue meeting I

Question no 1: Our travel companions

Question no 2: How do we listen to each other in Church?

Each person briefly introduces himself.

Go around the table briefly and ask each person how they feel about coming to the meeting.

INTRODUCTION

In this first meeting, we want to share with whom we walk in Church. We will also reflect on our listening experience in our Christian community and our diocese. Also, we will pray together, sharing our experiences of listening and not listening. Ask us: what is my listening experience in Church?

PRAYER TIME

Take the time to come up with who we are, take the time to focus on our breathing, unite our mind to our body, without judging ourselves; prepare ourselves to hear the breath of the Holy Spirit breathing in us and which unites us to one another. Let us be prepared to enter an attitude of listening and discernment.

Let us recite together the prayer to the Holy Spirit for the beginning of a synodal meeting. (Synod prayer)

WORD OF GOD (Mark 7, 31-37)

Jesus left the territory of Tire, and returned by Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, crossing the land of the Decapolis. A deaf man was brought to him who had difficulty speaking, and he was asked to lay his hands on him. He took him aside from the crowd, put his fingers in his ears, and touched his tongue with his own saliva; then, raising his eyes to heaven, he sighed, and said: Ephatha, that is to say, open yourself. Immediately his ears snapped open, his tongue loosened, and he spoke very well. Jesus told them not to tell anyone about it; but the more he recommended it to them, the more they published it. They were in the greatest astonishment and said: He does everything wonderfully; even he makes the deaf hear, and the dumb speak.

Let us recite psalm 99 together:

Hail the Lord, whole earth, serve the Lord with joy, come to him with songs of joy!

Know that the Lord is God: he made us, and we are his, we, his people, his flock.

Come to his house to give thanks to him, to his house sing his praises; give him thanks and bless his name!

Yes, the Lord is good, his love is eternal, his faithfulness remains from age to age.

Question no 3: Speak

INTRODUCTION

In today's meeting, starting with question 3, we will reflect on speaking in our Christian community and our diocese. Speaking out takes courage to express yourself freely and in charity. Then, starting from question 4, we will share our experiences of celebrations in the Church. We will answer the question: how our liturgical celebrations inspire our missionary action?

PRAYER TIME

Take the time to come up with who we are, take the time to focus on our breathing, unite our mind to our body, without judging ourselves; prepare ourselves to hear the breath of the Holy Spirit breathing in us and which unites us to one another. Let us be prepared to enter an attitude of listening and discernment.

Let us recite together the prayer to the Holy Spirit for the beginning of a synodal meeting. (Synod prayer)

WORD OF GOD (Colossians 3, 13-17)

Support each other and forgive each other if you have any complaints. The Lord has forgiven you: do the same. Above all of this, have love, which is the most perfect bond.

And may in your hearts reign the peace of Christ to which you have been called, you who are one body. Live in Thanksgiving. May the word of Christ dwell in you in all its richness; educate and rebuke one another in all wisdom; through inspired psalms, hymns, and songs, sing to God, in your hearts, your gratitude. And whatever you say, whatever you do, always in the name of the Lord Jesus, offering through him your thanksgiving to God the Father.

PRAYER TIME

Take the time to come up with who we are, take the time to focus on our breathing, unite our mind to our body, without judging ourselves; prepare ourselves to hear the breath of the Holy Spirit breathing in us and which unites us to one another. Let us be prepared to enter an attitude of listening and discernment.

Let us recite together the prayer to the Holy Spirit for the beginning of a synodal meeting. (Synod prayer)

WORD OF GOD (Acts of the Apostles 2, 41-47)

Then those who had accepted the word of Peter were baptized. About three thousand people joined them that day. They were assiduous in the teaching of the Apostles and in fellowship, in the breaking of bread and in prayers. The fear of God was in all hearts at the sight of the many wonders and signs performed by the Apostles. All the believers lived together, and they had everything in common; they sold their goods and possessions, and they divided the proceeds among all according to the needs of each.

Each day, with the same heart, they assiduously frequented the Temple, they broke bread in the houses, they ate their meals with joy and simplicity of heart; they praised God and had the favor of the whole people. Each day, the Lord added to them those who were to be saved.

INTRODUCTION

In today's meeting, starting with question 7, we will reflect on our relationships with members of other Christian denominations. In a synodal style, we make our decisions prepared to discern what the Holy Spirit is telling us in what we are living or not yet living in our community. This is the spirit of the 8th question.

PRAYER TIME

Take the time to come up with who we are, take the time to focus on our breathing, unite our mind to our body, without judging ourselves; prepare ourselves to hear the breath of the Holy Spirit breathing in us and which unites us to one another. Let us be prepared to enter an attitude of listening and discernment.

Let us recite together the prayer to the Holy Spirit for the beginning of a synodal meeting. (Synod prayer)

WORD OF GOD (Acts of the Apostles 6, 1-7)

In those days, as the number of disciples increased, the Greek-speaking brethren complained against the Hebrew-speaking ones, because the widows in their group were at a disadvantage in daily service.

The Twelve then called together all the disciples and said to them, "It is not good that we forsake the word of God and serve at tables. Rather, brothers, seek seven of you, men who are esteemed by all, filled with the Holy Spirit and with wisdom, and we will put them in this office. As far as we are concerned, we will remain assiduous in prayer and in the service of the Word." These words pleased everyone, and we chose:

Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, Philip, Procore, Nicanor, Timon, Parménas and Nicolas, a convert to Judaism from Antioch. They were presented to the Apostles, and after praying, they laid their hands on them. The word of God was fruitful, the number of disciples greatly increased in Jerusalem, and a large crowd of Jewish priests came to the obedience of the faith.

N.B.: During this meeting or, if necessary, during an additional meeting, discuss the 3 additional questions, namely questions 11 to 13. (page 12 of the diocesan document)

INTRODUCTION

"Synodality is at the service of the mission of the Church in which all its members are called to participate" (Vademecum for the Synod on Synodality). In today's meeting, we will reflect on the synodal style of our decisions and on the spirituality of "Walking Together". We will share our experience by answering the question: how do we carry the mission in Church in our Christian community and our diocese? Since we are all missionary disciples, how is each baptized person called to participate in the mission of the Church?

PRAYER TIME

Take the time to come up with who we are, take the time to focus on our breathing, unite our mind to our body, without judging ourselves; prepare ourselves to hear the breath of the Holy Spirit breathing in us and which unites us to one another. Let us be prepared to enter an attitude of listening and discernment.

Let us recite together the prayer to the Holy Spirit for the beginning of a synodal meeting. (Synod prayer)

WORD OF GOD (Luke 10, 1-11)

After this the Lord appointed seventy-two more of the disciples, and he sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he himself was going to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Therefore, pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on! Here I am sending you out like lambs during wolves. Do not carry purses, bags, or sandals, and do not greet anyone on the way. But in any house, you enter, say first, "Peace to this house." If there is a friend of peace there, your peace will rest with him; otherwise, it will come back to you. Stay in this house, eating and drinking what you are served, because the worker deserves his salary. Do not go from house to house. In any city you enter and be greeted, eat what is presented to you. Heal the sick who are there and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." But in any city, you enter and where you will not be welcomed, go to the squares and say, "Even the dust of your city, stuck to our feet, we remove it to leave it to you." However, know this: the reign of God has drawn near."

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Let us recite psalm 148 together:

Alleluia! Praise the Lord from on high, praise him in the heights.

You, all his angels, praise him, praise him, all universes. Praise him, sun and moon, praise him, all the stars of light; praise him, heavens of heavens, and the waters of the heights of heaven.

Let them praise the name of the Lord: at his command they were created; it was he who laid them down forever under a law that will not pass.

Praise the Lord from earth, sea monsters, all abysses; fire and hail, snow and fog, hurricane wind that fulfills his word; the trees of the orchards, all the cedars; The mountains and all the hills, the wild beasts and all the flocks, the reptile and the flying bird; the kings of the earth and all the peoples, the princes and all the judges of the earth; all young men and women, old men and children alike.

Let them praise the name of the Lord, the only one above all names; on heaven and on earth his splendor: he increases the vigor of his people.

Praise from all his devotees, from the sons of Israel, the people of his relatives! Alleluia!

RECOGNITION TIME

Going home, thinking back to what you heard in these dialogues, in the presence of the Risen One; ask yourself today and in the days to come: what is rising in me? What call is the Lord placing in me? You might catch yourself saying, "Lord, what do you want me to do?"

N. B.: Regarding additional questions 11 to 13, it would be appropriate to propose to live a 6th dialogue meeting. (Page 12 of the diocesan document)

To write the meeting report

This report should not exceed two printed pages.

- 1. Describe the group that met: level of involvement in the Church, membership (parishioners, religious, members of a committee, a service or a movement), young or old, homogeneous group or diversified, etc.
- 2. How did the process go: harmoniously? hardly? Why? If you adapted it, how did you do it?
- 3. From the notes that will have been collected during the conclusion (after the third round of dialogue), present the main conclusions reached by the group: observations, sources of joy or sadness, realizations, proposals, hopes, etc.
- 4. Did the group members leave satisfied with the experience? Why?
